Fortunately they caught the bad guys before my ID was compromised and I have since then taken steps for greater protection. Stay safe.



Identity Theft Protection

In 2013, 3.1 million Americans were victims of identity theft. Unfortunately, only 54% were notified by their financial institutions. The type of information the thieves need to steal

your identity is, your name, ber, birthday, mother's and account numbers. Anying your identity easier.

theft include; unusual activity on your bank accounts or credit cards, a bill you expect does not arrive, your purse or wallet are stolen, or you apply for credit and are denied.

How do identity thieves get this information? The easiest is your mail, either stolen from your mail box or your trash. This is the easiest to prevent by installing a lockable mailbox or use a PO Box, and shredding all mail with you name and address. If you pay bills by mail, never leave the payment with your check in your mailbox, for the postman to collect. If a thief takes your payment, they have your personal information and your checking account information.

At ATMs, shield the keypad when you enter your PIN number. Identity thieves install skimmers on the card slot to steal your card data and use cameras to steal your PIN.

Protect yourself over the phone, by never giving personal information unless you initiated the call. Credit card companies never call you and ask for personal information. Secure your mobile device data, e-mail, etc., by using encryption software.

On social media, Facebook, Linkedin, etc., never ever post personal information. You may employ a high level of protection on your information, but if your "friends" do not, you are vulnerable. And only post about your vacations after you are safely back home.

Use password protection programs such as a Dashlane or LastPass to protect your password. If you believe your identity has been stolen:

- Contact the three major credit bureaus and place a fraud alert on your file.
 - Transunion 1-888-680-7289
 - Experian 1-888-397-3742
 - Equifax 1-888-766-0008
- Contact your credit card companies.
- Contact your local police and get a copy of the crime report.
- Contact Social Security Administration Office of the Inspector General at 1-800-772-1213 if you suspect benefit or welfare fraud.
- Contact the passport office at 1-877-487-2778 to prevent a bad guy from obtaining a passport in your name.

JMRA Facebook Site

The Facebook page for Johns Manville Retirees Association is a "closed" site, meaning its membership is restricted to retirees from JM. To join, you have to send a request from the page and be approved as a retiree.

Recently, we have had a number of people requesting to join who are not JM retirees.

JM has agreed to help us by searching the JM pension census which includes all 36,000 retirees, deceased, term vested and active employees who would be eligible for pension when we have an applicant we can't confirm.

Recently, we chose to ignore a number of requests since they could not be verified as JM retirees.

When we get a new request, we respond immediately, asking when and where they worked for JM and when they retired. However, the message we send is rarely seen, since responding to an individual who is not our Facebook "friend" forces our response message to go into their "Other" messages tab rather than their "Inbox" default tab, so the messages we send are rarely seen or responded to.

Please include information on when and where you worked for JM, and when you retired, and your request to join will be approved.

JM Anniversaries in 2014

In late July and early August, the Qingpu and Luoyang plants in China celebrated 20 years of operation with a variety of activities, including a buffet and karaoke in Qingpu and an employee outing in Luoyang. More than 100 employees participated in the festivities.

Then in September, the Cleburne, Texas plant celebrated 50 years with a picnic for current employees, retirees and their families. Several guests from corporate and local government also attended. Activities included service recognitions, face painters, a petting zoo, plant tours and a game to guess how many JM glass marbles were contained in a very large jar. Retiree Martin Morin came the closest with his guess and won a Samsung Galaxy tablet.

The McPherson, Kan. plant celebrated its 40th anniversary on October 10 with a ribbon-cutting and plant rededication and a Family Day celebration on October 11 for employees, retirees and families that included a picnic, egg toss, bingo and plant tours. An employee team put together a commemorative booklet about the plant's history.

EPA's Top SmartWay® Award

M has been recognized with the EPA 2014 SmartWay® Excellence Award for outstanding environmental performance and leadership.

The SmartWay Excellence Award is reserved for the top participants among SmartWay Partners and is the EPA's highest recognition for demonstrated leadership in energy and environmental performance in freight management. JM was one of 11 companies to receive this distinction, representing the best environmental performers out of nearly 3,000 partners.

Director of EPA's Office of Transportation and Air Quality Chris Gundler said, "Since the launch of the SmartWay Transport Partnership in 2004, partner carriers have cut carbon pollution while saving fuel expenses for their customers. They have reduced thousands of tons of dangerous pollutants and climate altering greenhouse gases, while raising the bar on a sustainable transportation future."

In 2008, JM's Global Logistics team set a new course to take control of its fuel spend while at the same time achieving an optimal system to monitor the efficiency of the trucks doing the hauling. The solution was to enlist as a SmartWaysm Transport Carrier. In addition, JM's Hazel Township, Pa. fleet of trucks – JM's only facility with its own fleet – was certified as a SmartWay carrier in 2012. Partner carriers are committed to fuel efficiency and follow operational practices which limit emissions. Both the shipper and carrier are equipped with tools to monitor and track progress towards achieving fuel efficiency and emission goals.

"As a SmartWay-certified shipper, our commitment is to monitor our current environmental performance level as established by the program and ship at least 50 percent of our goods using partner carriers," said David Fisher, JM's director of global logistics. "We're now proud to report that we ship 86 percent of our freight through participating carriers, substantiating JM's continuing commitment to sustainable business practices that help our environment and improve our efficiencies."

JM Marbles Inspires Artist

aya Lin is a notable public artist and the architect of the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial in Washington, D.C. Lin is currently working on an installation to recreate the Chesapeake Bay and its waterways, and her medium is JM's #475 glass marbles manufactured at JM's Defiance, Ohio complex. JM will donate the marbles to Lin, who will be constructing the piece at the Renwick Gallery in the Smithsonian Museum.

Lin contacted JM to request the marbles for the project because she recalled that her father, Henry Huan Lin, a noted ceramicist and former dean of the Ohio University College of Fine Arts, used them in his own work.

"The first request was for a few marbles," said Jeff Shock, research and development platform leader for glass technology. "They liked those and requested an additional 500 pounds, which JM is working to supply. Ultimately. Lin will need a few thousand pounds of marbles."

This donation harkens back to the legacy of Dominick Labino. Labino, an internationally known scientist, inventor and master craftsman in glass, was JM's vice president and research and development director from 1958 to 1965 and research consultant until 1975. He created the #475 glass chemistry that has a long working range, making it suitable for glass blowing. He is considered one of the founders of the studio art glass movement, and a piece he created for JM is now a feature in the newly remodeled executive offices at world headquarters.

Even with the latest and greatest technology gadgets that you own, you still could fall victim to online lidentity theft and fraud. It is very important to remember that when entering any personal information that you are utilizing a secure network.

We recommend that you keep an eye on the website address and make sure that it is HTTPS not HTTP. Why? HTTPS is a secure online website coded specifically to keep your information safe during transit from your machine to their servers. Many hackers have been able to spoof certain popular sites such as Verizon that directs you to a false page that utilizes just standard HTTP (Hyper Text Transfer Protocol), or just develop a non-secure shopping site with bogus products.

It is very important that if you are buying online that it is from a reputable company/manufacturer. If it sounds too good to be true, then it probably is. Also, do not just readily input your personal information online, especially to download/or receive a free product.
